Novel in a Year (Part 1)

Students will be able to write a complete novel by the end of the school year. They will learn structure and essential elements of a novel. Full curriculum (a \$200 value) is included. Feedback from peers, teachers, and published authors will be provided.

America (1600-1865)

Students will work through the History of America from the year 1600 through 1865, beginning with the Mayflower all the way through to the Civil War. In the Spring session, our study of history will continue from the year 1865 to the present, picking up with the understanding of the Reconstruction era.

Thursdays 9:30 a.m.–12p.m.

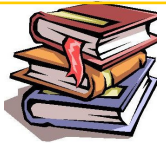


- **Participants:** 6-8th and 9-12th
